

Texas vs Kansas Betting Odds

The Texas Longhorns have made their way to Lawrence, Kansas for a Big 12 North versus South showdown. The game will begin at 12:30pm ET at Memorial Stadium. College football betting odds at Sportsbook.com are favoring Texas -13 on the road.

The Longhorns are having a special year and they still have a shot at the BCS National Championship game despite their loss to Texas Tech a couple of weeks ago. However, they need a few things to break their way and they must take care of business against the capable Jayhawks today.

Texas did not let their loss to the Red Raiders linger as they dispatched the Baylor Bears by a score of 45-21 last weekend. On the year, the Longhorns are posting 44.3 points per game and 40.8 in Big 12 action.

The Jayhawks have fallen on hard times of late and their hopes for a Big 12 North title are all but gone. Kansas has lost three of their last four outings and they are 3-3 in conference play. However, they are 5-1 at home this season, their lone home loss coming at the hands of undefeated TexasTech.

Mark Mangino's troops are certainly able to put points on the scoreboard, but they will need to find a way to slow Colt McCoy and the Longhorns to have a chance this afternoon.
